

## **Academic Year Definitions**

## Non-Standard Term Programs

Students are expected to follow their schedule and complete each class as scheduled. Students who enrolled on or after December 7, 2009 are considered to be enrolled in terms of equal length. Aid is awarded per attempted credits each term. There are three different academic year definitions for out non-standard terms programs: 24 Credits/30 weeks, 24 credits / 32 weeks, and 24 credits / 36 weeks. Each programs specific academic year is listed in the catalog

## Non-Term Programs

Non-term programs are programs that are measured in clock hours. They are considered to be clock hour program because they do not feed into a degree program for the student. For a clock hour program to be considered a full time program where no proration is required, it must contain a minimum of 900 clock hours and 30 weeks. For programs with less than the required amount, a proration will need to be performed to determine eligible aid. More information on proration will be found in that section.
